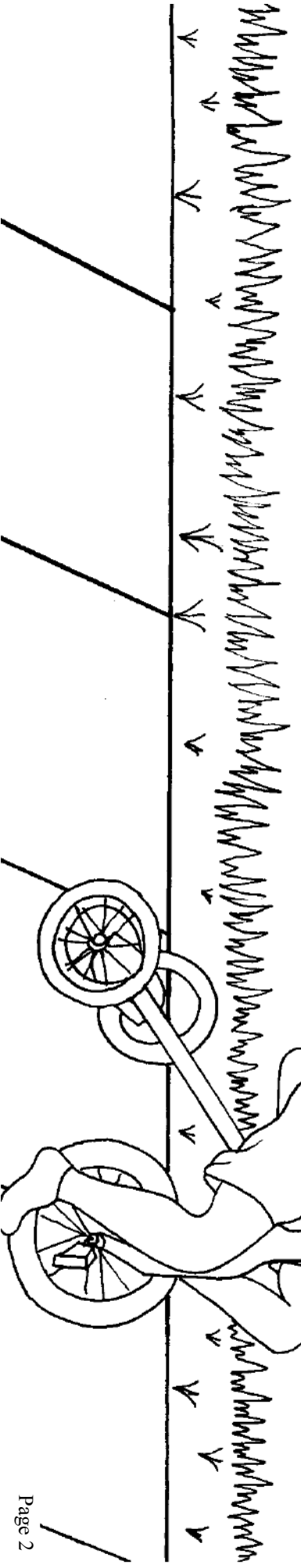
DON'T JUDGE A BOOK BY IT'S COVER

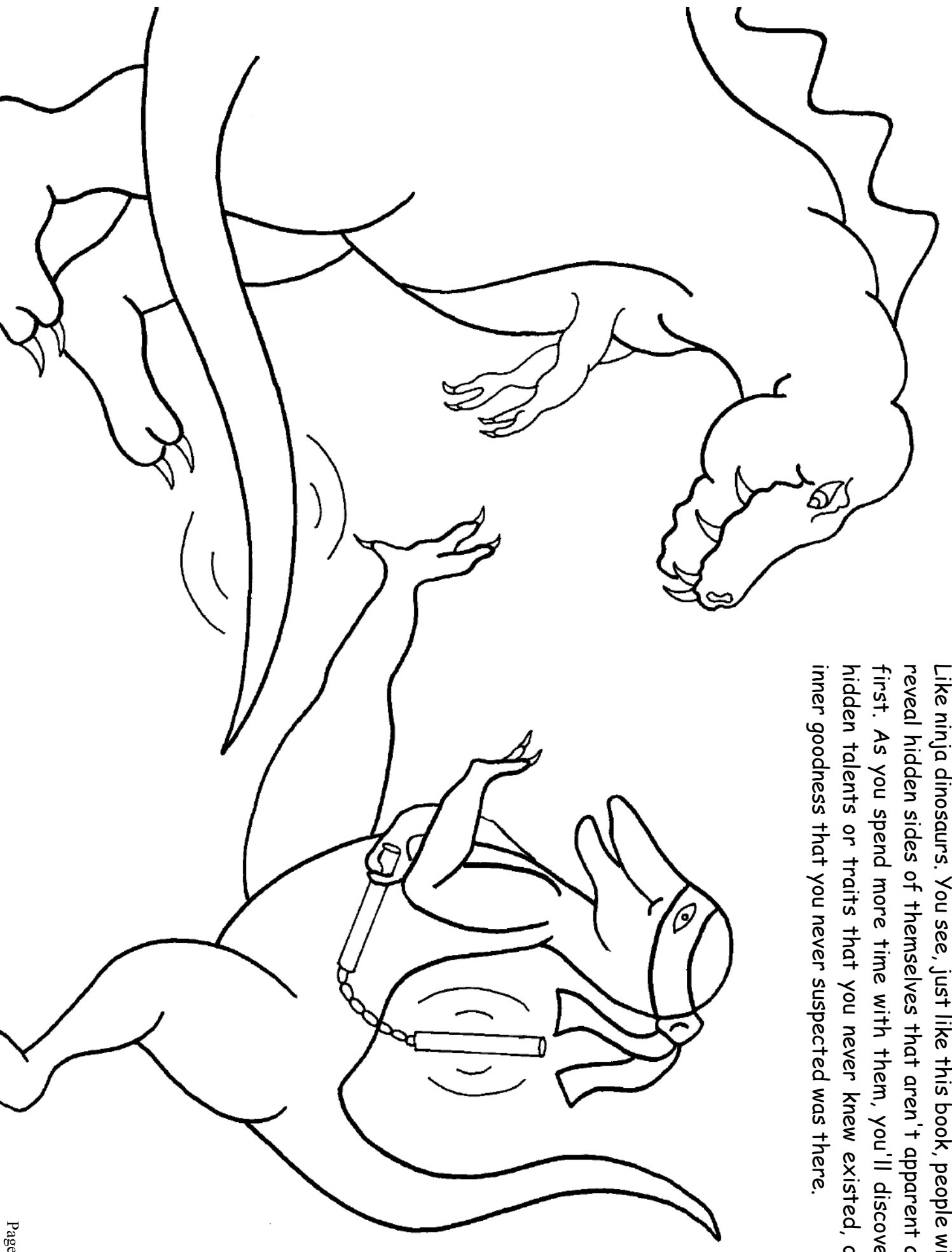

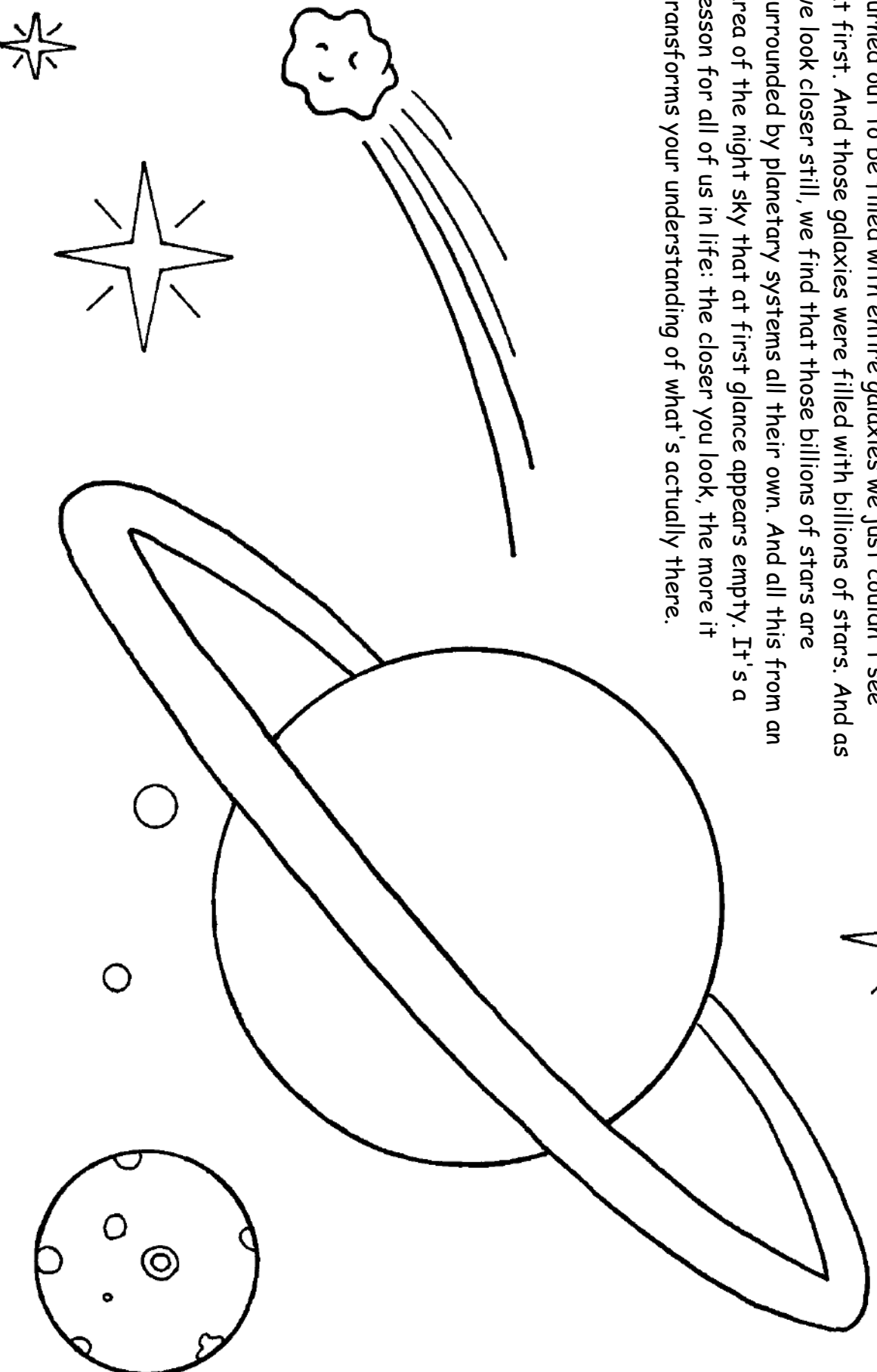
